Richard T. Dundon, 92, of Bethlehem, died on October 29, 2020. He was born in Glenarm, MD; son of the late James and Sarah (Connolly) Dundon. Dick was recently preceded in death by his beloved wife and best friend, Regina M. (Komenas) Dundon, who passed in May.

Dick was a graduate of Liberty High School. He proudly served in the 2nd Armored Division of the U.S. Army. This division played an important role in several invasions during WWII; including the occupation of Germany. He worked for the Bethlehem Steel Corp. for over 40 years, retiring as a manager in the Sheet Products Marketing Department.
